Background

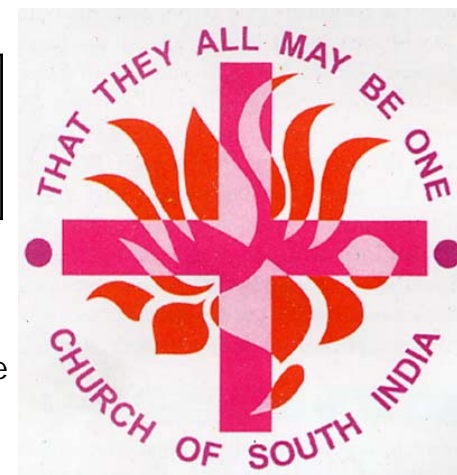
In this photograph, taken on a Sunday morning, the members of the congregation of Central Church in Vellore stand around chatting after the service and before going home for their midday meal.

Central Church is the main church in the Diocese of Vellore, it is like the cathedral of the Diocese of Vellore (although it is not usually called that). The church has a large Sunday School of over three hundred children which meets in the basement underneath the church. Three senior pastors (vicars) run the church. Other groups which meet regularly during the week to pray and learn together are the Men's Fellowship, the Women's Fellowship and the Youth Fellowship. There is also a large choir.

The church has open sides and is typical of the churches in the Diocese of Vellore with whitewashed walls and a large red cross at its highest point. It is on the street called "Officers' Line" which is the main street of the town.

The Tamil message across the front is Jesus' words found in John chapter 14 verse 6: "I am the way, the truth and the life"
